## Automated, flexible management of loading equipment and empties

While warehouse and distribution workers don't need to worry about tracking and managing this equipment, account and supply-chain managers can configure it flexibly for each customer and trading partner, decoupled from the product inventory. Working with Carrier and Empties Management is more efficient and accurate than the conventional use of spreadsheets, and its integration with Dynamics 365 ensures that the tasks of accounting for and tracking assets are never omitted or delayed.

For individual as well as for nested items – such as liquid containers in crates, loaded on pallets – the solution automatically calculates the costs associated with loading assets and empties, and follows their movements through the transactions in which they occur. You can decide how to allocate deposits or other fees, and track the balance of loading items and empties for trading partners involved in a transaction.

In addition to inserting verbiage or linkages to it on forms and items, you can configure text to appear as an on-screen alert at certain process steps. You can also bundle texts and let them be inherited together.

## Complete visibility of asset movements and finances

Management activities to do with transport and packaging assets in the ERP system can always be tied to the original documentation or contracts with the companies you do business with. Among other entities, you can link transfers of loading and bundle equipment to orders, invoices, deliveries, intracompany transfers, customers, transport services, and warehouse locations. Instead of vague sunk costs, you have a clear view of the financials of loading assets and empties. If items are not returning to your facilities from a customer or supply-chain partner, you know which they are and how many are missing.

You can take advantage of Carrier and Empties Management to bring transparency and control to the management of containers, pallets, empties, and other equipment no matter whether you own it or whether you receive it from the owner in transactions.
