Implemented training for factory and supplier workers for career progression and to promote digital learning and access to Microsoft technology classes.

Required suppliers to follow Microsoft's Workers Communities Guidelines to promote decent working and living conditions for workers in the factories.

In FY20, 100% of new suppliers were screened using social criteria.

Continued to enhance our due diligence process through enforcing of supplier contracts, on-boarding training, supplier assessment and audits, corrective action and verification, sub-tier management and the Workers' Voice Hotline. \$256,954 of recruitment fees and insufficient wages were repaid by suppliers to 5,401 employees, including \$207,445 of recruitment fees repaid to 2,316 employees.
