About

The Data8 Validation solution adds Data8's email validation and telephone validation services into the forms of Dataverse/Dynamics 365 CE, ensuring that contact details are validated on entry to improve your data quality and user experience. It also introduces the ability to go back and historically look at your existing data and analyse that in order to see your data hygiene levels.

For the solution to function, you must have a Data8 account with access to the Email Validation and/or Phone Validation services. If you do not already have an account, you can register for a free trial online at <https://www.data-8.co.uk/register>.

Obtaining an API Key

Go to <https://www.data-8.co.uk/dashboard/api-keys/> and click "Add API Key". Give the API key a friendly name before pressing save.

This field will be enabled once the API key has been saved and generated.

Save Close

Once the key is saved, you are able to add a "Domain" to the "Allowed Domains". Enter the domain name of your Dataverse/Dynamics 365 instance and click "Add".

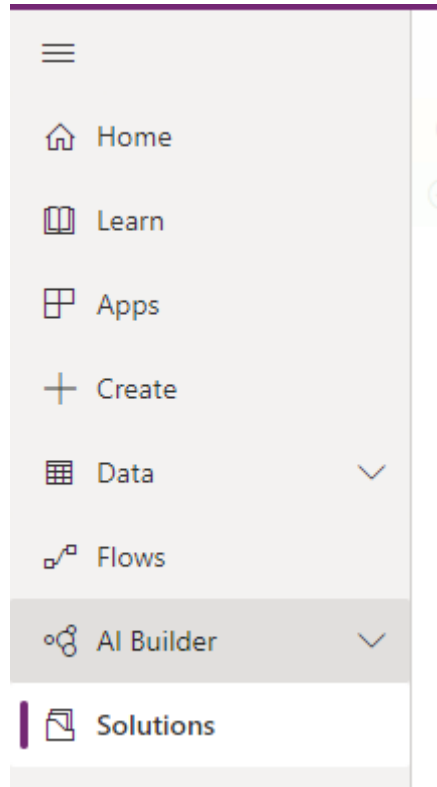
Store this key somewhere as this is your "Client Side" Key.

You then need to create a second key but DO NOT add a domain to it – this will be your "Server Side" key. You'll need both of these shortly.

Installing the solution

Note: If you installed the solution from AppSource then this step will have been completed for you.

You will have been provided with a zip file containing the solution. To install it, open <https://make.powerapps.com>, ensure you're in the right environment in the top right of the page and navigate to "Solutions" on the bottom of the left nav bar.



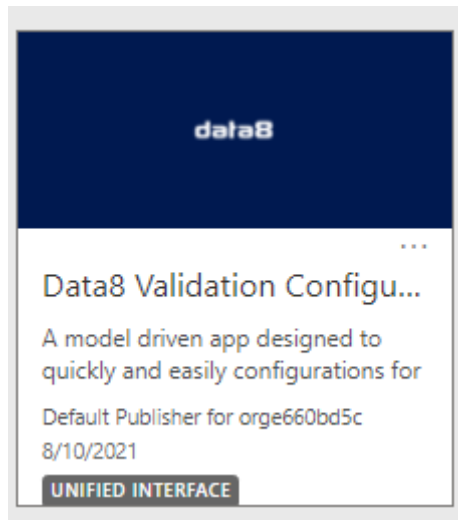
Click "Import" and select the zip file you have been sent, and then click "Next".

Click "Next" again and the solution will be imported.

Click "Close" and the solution has now been imported.

Initial Configuration of the solution

Once install, navigate to your list of “Apps” and open the “Data8 Validation Configuration” model driven app.



You will be shown a screen to enter both your keys you made earlier and “Save All Settings”.

Enter the international dialling code to assume when a number doesn't have one explicitly, e.g. "1" to assume numbers are in North America, 44 for UK, 33 for France etc. Any number entered with explicit country code e.g. "+44 151 355 4555" will be validated according to that country code, others will use the country code entered here.

Telephone numbers are validated according to different rules for different countries. If a telephone number contains a full international code, the country will be determined from the number itself. If no international dialling code is specified, the country entered in the Default Telephone Validation Country Code setting is assumed.

This defaults to 44. If you are outside of the UK you will want to change this to the international dialling code for your country (e.g. 1 for US, 33 for France etc.) so that telephone numbers are validated according to the rules for the correct country.

Once your global settings are set up, you need to configure column by column mappings in order to store the validation results.

This is an optional column for you to store when the phone number was validated to keep your data quality up to date. Alternatively you can select "Create a new field" and allow the page to create the field for you.

Once you have selected your values, click "Save" before repeating for all other phone fields. Each time you "Save", the mapping will move to "Existing Mappings".

Email addresses are validated to the level specified on this page:

- **Syntax** ensures only that the email address is in the correct format. This is the fastest level of validation but will allow through the most invalid email addresses.
- **Domain** ensures that the domain name (to the right of the @ sign) is valid and is configured to accept email. This is normally the best level in terms of speed and accuracy.
- **Server** ensures that there is an email server currently live and ready to accept email for the domain. This will eliminate dormant domains but increases the time required to perform the validation.
- **Address** ensures the mail server accepts email for the exact mailbox. This is the most precise level of validation but does have a false positive rate, especially for consumer email addresses.

With the Suggest Email Address Corrections box checked, misspelt email addresses can be corrected automatically.

Target Fields must be a "Choice" field, made with the provided global choice called 'Email Validation Status' - we do not provide these fields. You can either make the fields yourself through [the maker portal](#) or select "Create a new field" option. Last Checked Fields must be a "DateTime" field - we do not provide these fields. You can either make the fields yourself through [the maker portal](#) or select "Create a new field" option.

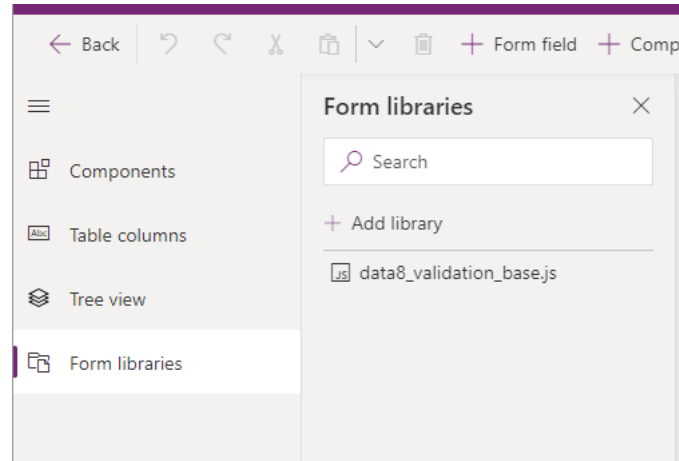

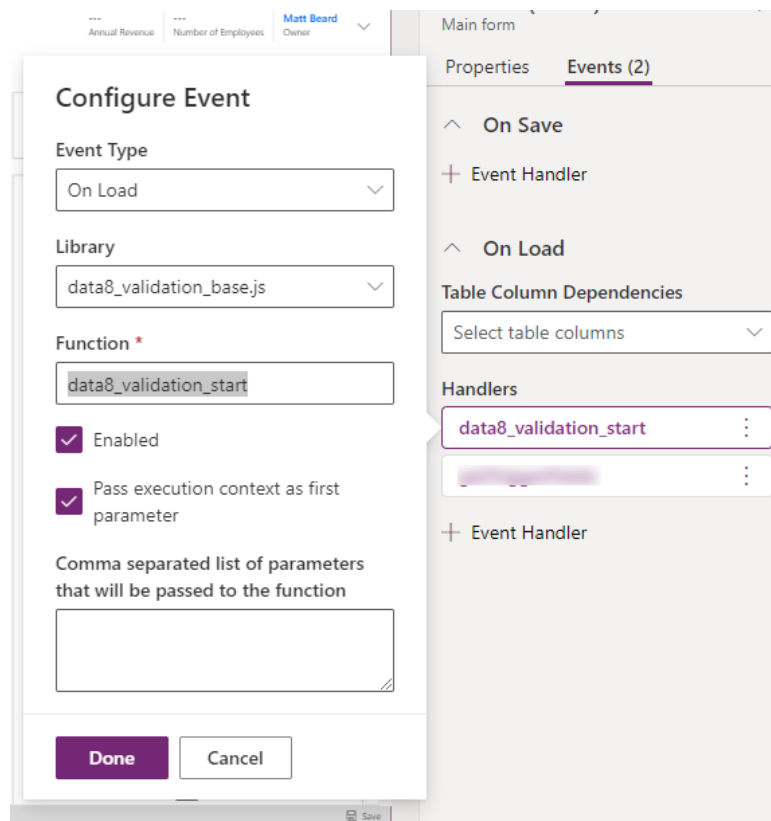
Making the validation work

For the real time validation to work, you need to make a few form amendments. Starting at <https://make.powerapps.com> go through your normal process to amend a form.

Select “Form Libraries” on the left-hand side and add the “data8_validation_base.js” library to your form.



Once this is added, add an event handler to the “On Load” event of your form called data8_validation_start, ensuring the execution context is passed as the first parameter.

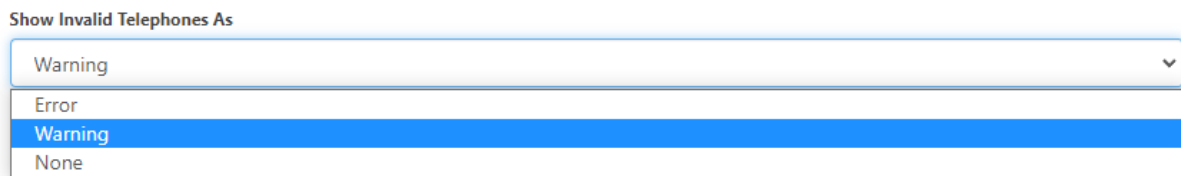


Save and publish your form and it should immediately begin working. You can optionally add the target columns and last checked columns if you wish, although this is optional.

Setting the Error Level

Within the configuration page of the “Data8 Validation Configuration” app you can specify behaviour experienced when an invalid piece of data is input. By both telephone and email, you will see a dropdown box:

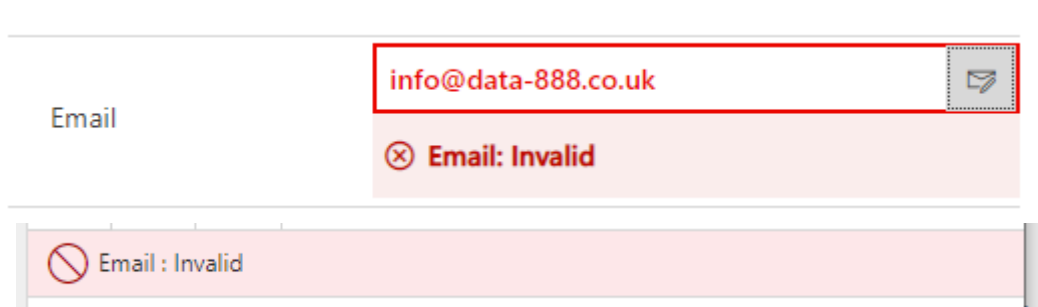

Error

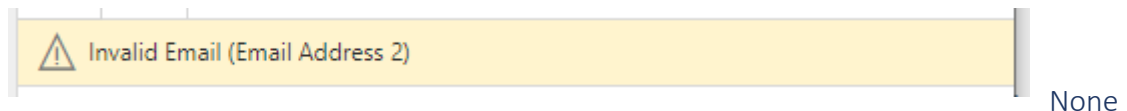
Error will prevent the saving of the form and give an alert next to the invalid field, as well as on the top of the form on save.

Warning

Warning will give an alert at the top of the page of any invalid data. This will not prevent the user saving.

There will be no prompt on the screen, however the fields that store the valid status will still be automatically updated.

Overriding on a Form by Form basis

The options above as for a global set up and each table using the validation will adhere to that configuration, however you can override this on particular forms during the event handler set up.

The overrides are always specified as “Telephone Override”, “Email Override”. If you only want to override one type, leave the other one blank so for example, the following image would leave Telephone as it’s global setting but override Email on this form to be “Warning” instead.

Running Validation in batch

The batch validation works first by performing a count of the records that need to be checked and asking for your authorisation to charge that many credits to your account. You will be warned before you are billed.

Pre-Requisites

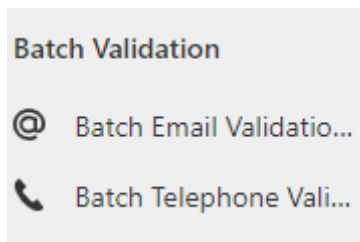
We need to be able to connect to your CRM for the solution to work correctly. Please enter your connection details at <https://www.data-8.co.uk/Dashboard/CrmConnections>.

When registering your connection, you will be given an option of using either a user account or an application user. Please assign the relevant security permissions to whichever user you have opted to use.

At minimum we will need the "Data8 Validation Batch" role. On top of that, we will need relevant permissions to perform the actions you want us to perform (i.e. if you are batch validating contacts, we would need applicable permissions for contacts).

Creating a job

To run the validation in batch, you need to reopen the Data8 Validation Configuration model driven app. Here you will notice the "Batch Validation" area on the left-hand side.



Depending on whichever type you wish to run and select that table. For the demo we will go with email.

Start by creating a new row in that table.

You need three fields here:

Job Name:

This is a friendly name for your reference.

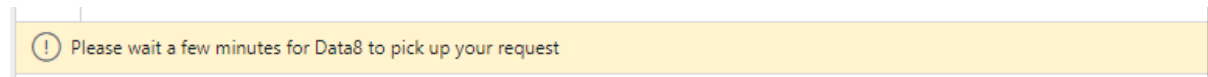
Entity Name:

This is the logical name of the table you wish to check. Any existing mappings will be used (as defined earlier).

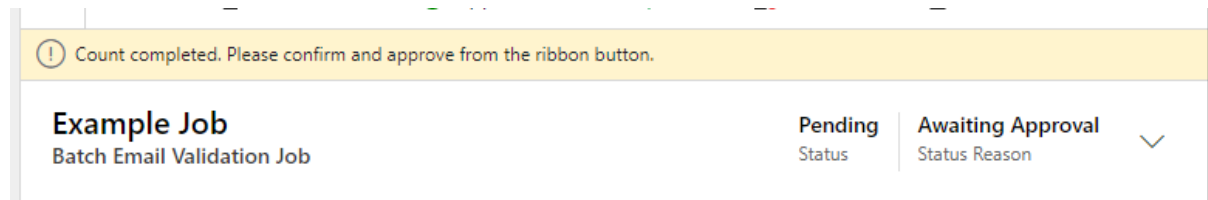
Saved View Filter:

You may not want to revalidate all your rows – this is a saved view option to allow a subset. For example, you may have a saved view of “Unvalidated Email Addresses” so you would just type that in. If left blank, all rows will be validated.

Enter the details and save the row and you will see an alert



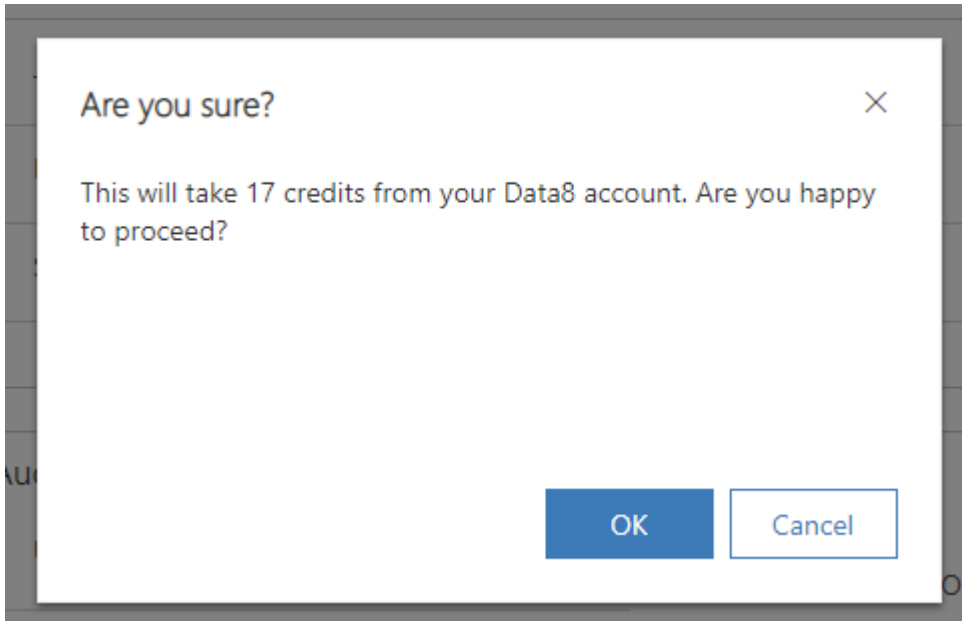
This is contacting our servers to let us know of your request. Once we have picked up your job, the form will change.



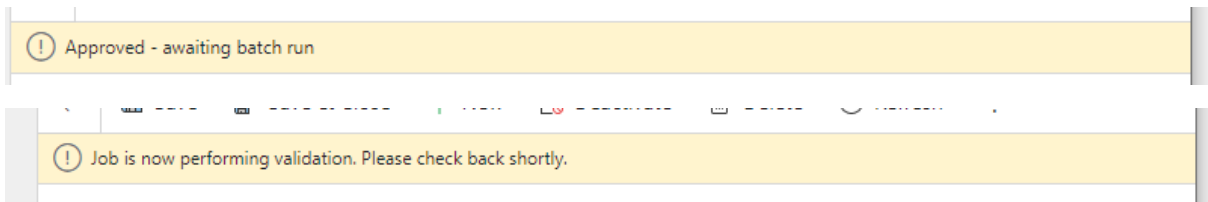
A new section will also be visible showing you how many emails you have and will need to validate.

If you are happy with those values, click “Approve Count” in the ribbon. At this point, you will be asked to confirm – this is the moment you will be charged credits.



Once approved, the form will change again



Once complete, a final new section will be visible showing your top-level statistics. If you also go and look at the rows in the table, you'll see the status fields are all now populated, as are the last checked dates (if configured).
