



Adult assessments for classification and case planning

SRNA

Developed by the Washington State Institute for Public Policy, the Static Risk Assessment 2.0 is based on offender demographics and criminal history while the Offender Needs Assessment allows for greater information gathering to be used in the identification of top criminogenic needs for case planning purposes.

WRNA

In 2008, the National Institute of Corrections in cooperation with the University of Cincinnati announced the availability of a series of new risk and need assessments for adult, women offenders. The Women's Risk/Needs Assessment (WRNA) assesses both gender-neutral and gender responsive factors and affords separate forms for probation, prison, and pre-release. A supplemental version of the tool also exists for use in conjunction with other needs tools like the SRNA. The WRNA is now implemented in jurisdictions across 28 states.

ODARA

Finally, an actuarial tool for your domestic violence caseload! The Ontario Domestic Assault Risk Assessment is a leading actuarial domestic violence risk assessment tool designed to identify the risk of future assaults against intimate partners.

IDA

The American Parole and Parole Association and National Highway Transportation Administration partnered to create the Impaired Driving Assessment. This tool helps to identify increased risk of future occurrences of DUI and determine the most appropriate community supervision to manage such risk.

TCUDS II

The Texas Christian Drug Screen II is a reliable and effective tool when used to assess the severity of drug use problems, including alcohol.

VPRAI

The Virginia Pretrial Risk Assessment Instrument is designed to identify the likelihood of failure to appear in court, the danger to the community posed by a defendant pending trial, and to assist pretrial officers in making a bail recommendation.

DRAOR

The DRAOR is a 19-item case management measure that augments traditional risk instruments by assessing Stable and Acute dynamic risks as well as Protective factors. Elevated acute risk scores predict likelihood and imminence of failure.
