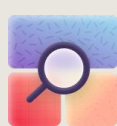

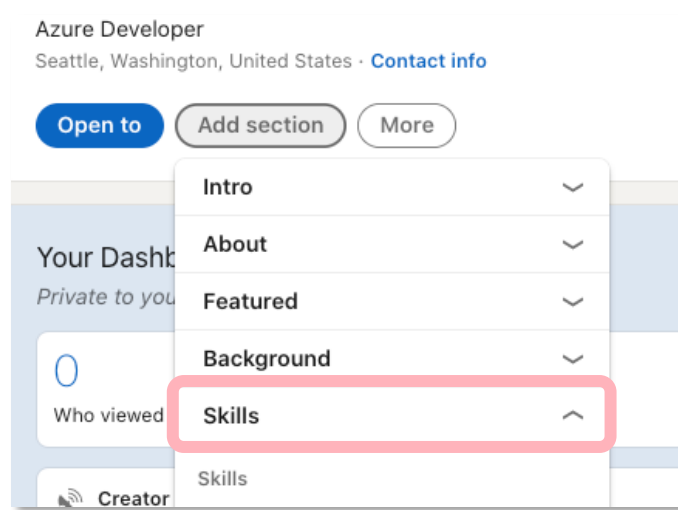

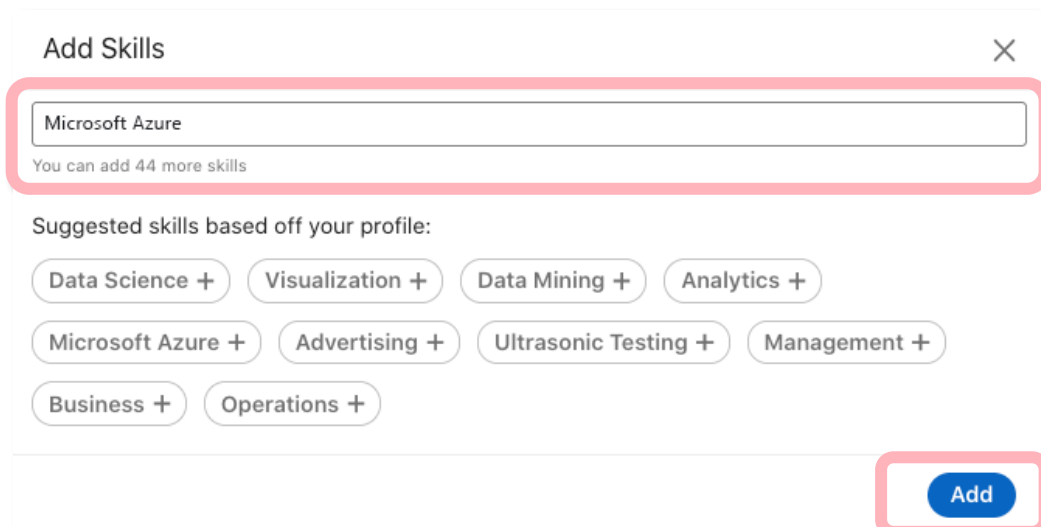
How to share Microsoft skills on LinkedIn

- 1 On your [LinkedIn home page](#) ribbon, select **Me**.
- 2 Select **View Profile**.
- 3 Then, in the **Skills & endorsements** section, select **Add a new skill**.

Note: If you haven't already added this section to your profile, on your LinkedIn page, underneath the ribbon, select **Add section** and then select **Skills**.



- 4 In the **Add skills** box, start entering the name of a skill (For e.g., Microsoft Azure, Azure DevOps, Azure SQL, etc.) and then select it from the offered options. If your skill isn't on the list, enter the full skill name.
- 5 Select **Add**.
