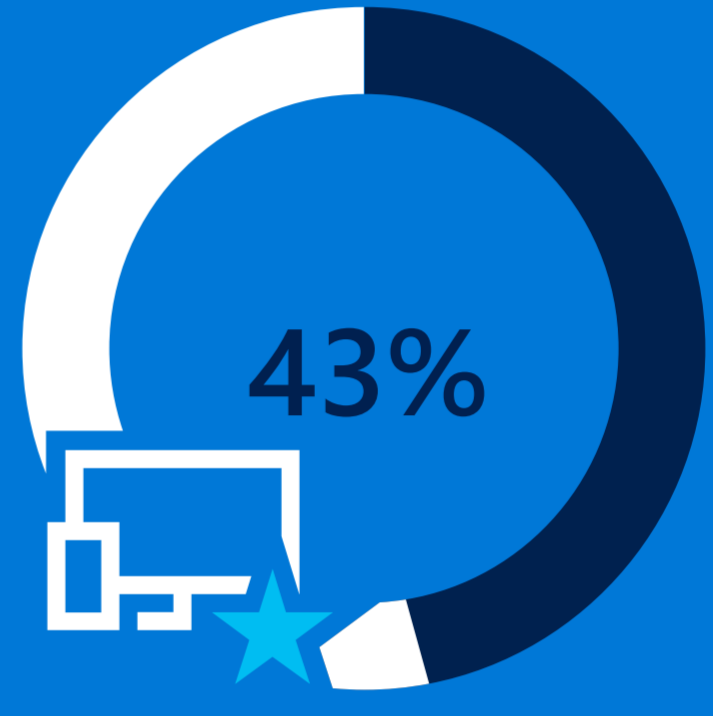


Remote work by the numbers

The number of remote workers has increased four-fold in just the past 20 years.¹ In many organizations, the location of their employees is not a barrier to doing great work. According to a Gallup poll, the majority of Americans believe remote workers are just as productive as those who work in a business office.¹

Average round-trip commute in U.S. is 54 minutes.² That's the equivalent of 30 extra work days per year.



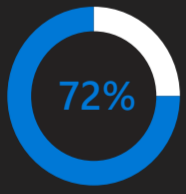
Earth:
Reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 54 million tons—the equivalent of taking almost 10 million cars.²



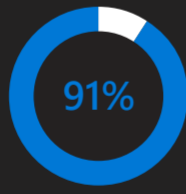
Business:

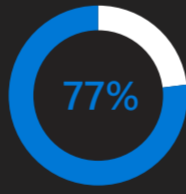
More organizations are offering employees the flexibility to work remotely—here's why you might consider it, too.



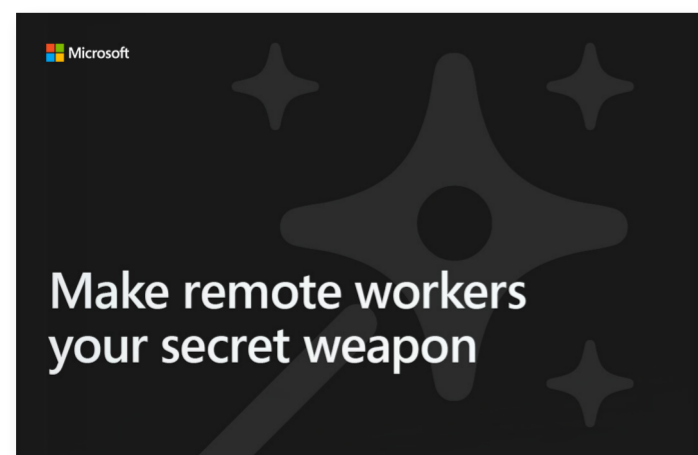
Improve retention:
